

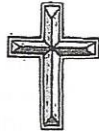

Facts not Fiction - Background

- Before Homeland Security Act of 2002 and the Trafficking Victims protection Reauthorization Act of 2008, unaccompanied children from countries other than the United States are transferred from the custody of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to the Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR) of the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS).
- Then placed in child shelters or released to family in the US until their immigration proceedings, which can take years.
- Prior to 2011, approximately 8,000 of these children entered the US each year.
